

Dear Pastors and Administrators,

As you know we are coming up on the conclusion of this year's Deanery visits. Monsignor Joseph Grimaldi, your local Regional Episcopal Vicar and I have listened to your suggestions and concerns, and the conversations have personally been very encouraging to me.

As we look to the new pastoral year, I am committed to implement our Reconfiguration Process, with its three different stages throughout our diocese, in order to effectively utilize our financial and clergy personnel resources. The purpose of the Reconfiguration Process is to strengthen the relationship that already exists among parish communities in particular areas of our diocese and to enhance the varied ministries that each parish offers, while collaborating, partnering or merging with another parish.

Collaboration, partnerships, or parish mergers are taking place in many dioceses and a number of parishes share their pastor with at least one other parish with that number growing. The issues we face here in our diocese, though unique in their own ways, are similar to what is happening throughout the country. We are one family in faith.

With this in mind, pastors in each deanery have been tasked to discuss and adjust their Mass schedules in collaboration with the other parishes in their deanery this coming Fall. You are also strongly encouraged to work with neighboring parishes outside your assigned deanery, if pastorally necessary. To that effect, I am asking that no Mass intentions be taken after June 30, 2025. It is essential that every parish share in this commitment.

You will hear more about this process in the coming months, and you are encouraged to engage actively in the consultation opportunities at the deanery level. Please provide your thoughts and ideas to your Dean. This is an important moment for new opportunities in our diocese. It is crucial that this process be rooted in prayer and open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I ask that you be faithful to patient discernment and committed to creating a plan with your Parish Leadership, Dean and Regional Vicar that will set the roadmap for the future vitality and vibrancy of all our parishes in Brooklyn and Queens.

Thank you for your cooperation as we embark in this new phase of reconfiguration in our diocese. Be assured of my continued prayers for each of you and parish communities.

Dear Friends,

As you know, I have been reporting Mass attendance figures since last fall. Above, you see the spreadsheet for Mass attendance for the first 4 weeks of every month from January to June this year. Keep in mind that we have two fewer priests assisting with weekend Masses going forward with Msgr. Strynkowski's "retirement" and Fr. Lee's transfer. We are blessed to have both Bishop Chappetto and Fr. Krlis as senior priests in residence here at St. Luke, and we are truly grateful for the assistance they provide throughout the year. However, at the end of the day, we have to acknowledge the fact that only two priests – Fr. Chin and I – are officially assigned to St. Luke parish.

In Bishop Brennan's letter, he asks parishes to adjust Mass schedules based on their own needs and in collaboration with neighboring parishes. Some considerations: (1) our church has a "comfortable capacity" of about 500; (2) with the exception of the 5:00 PM Sunday Mass, our schedule is identical to that of St. Mel. Initial thoughts: (1) perhaps our larger community would benefit from an earlier Saturday Vigil Mass at 4:30 instead of 5:00? (2) since the combined attendance at the 7:30 AM and 9:00 AM Masses is comparable to the attendance of the later Masses, maybe a bi-lingual Mass at around 8:30 AM with an English homily should be considered? Fr. Chin preaches in English when he celebrates the Italian Mass, and Bishop Chappetto puts a lot of effort into providing an Italian homily when he celebrates the Mass. As pastor, I need to rotate through the Masses as the schedule allows to be available to all the people of the parish, and a good number of English-speakers prefer an early Mass on Sunday.

No decisions have been made, but I'd like to hear from parishioners. Another element of the discussion is the probable partnership with St. Mel over the next several years, which will likely result in one pastor for both parishes, and maybe even a merger. This is a reality being faced all over the diocese with the rapidly declining number of clergy available to serve our parishes, as well as the decline in attendance and resources provided to sustain the parishes. The ultimate goal is the effective preaching of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Be assured that the diocese will do its best to maintain the presence and mission of the Catholic Church in our area. We rely on your prayerful support, as well as your patience, understanding, and valuable input.
