



I hope and pray that your New Year has started off well. Not only is it a new secular year, but, for the Catholic Church, it is a Jubilee Year. Every 25 years, the Church proclaims a Holy Year – a Jubilee Year – to focus on the mercy that has been granted to us through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord. Holy Doors are opened in the Major Basilicas in Rome, and in Cathedral Churches all around the world. Making a pilgrimage during the Jubilee Year and walking through the Holy Doors gives the faithful an opportunity to gain indulgences for themselves and others and to avail themselves of the special mercy of God. Jubilee Years can also be a time to forgive debt, to set captives free, and to do other merciful acts in recognition of the salvation Jesus won for us. Pope Francis announced a theme for this Jubilee Year: *Pilgrims of Hope*. We live in a world that wants us to place our hope and trust in material or imperfect realities. Our true hope is JESUS CHRIST, and so, as His disciples, we have to make a return to the Lord as pilgrims who are willing to imitate his sacrifices and

follow his ways. May we accompany one another on this pilgrim journey during this Jubilee Year!

This weekend the Christmas themes continue with our celebration of the Epiphany. Some cultures call this "Little Christmas" and it is a more important celebration for them at this time of year. An "epiphany" is a new insight or awareness. For the Church, we celebrate today the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles represented by the magi. While Jesus was certainly sent to bring salvation to God's chosen people, He also brought the Good News to other peoples, including Samaritans. The magi follow the star, honor the Child with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, and then announce the Good News as they return. Let us make a gift of our lives to God and to others as we share God's grace and mercy in our celebration of the Nativity of our Lord.



At the end of the month we will begin a 10-week faith formation program called *Symbolon*. It's available on our parish subscription to FORMED, but sometimes programs like that are more fruitful when they are done in a small group setting. Each week there is a video presentation, followed by a discussion of the topic presented. The optional workbook provides additional information and is a good resource. We have several parishioners already signed up, so I look forward to the experience with all who wish to participate. *Symbolon* actually has two 10-week programs, so we will likely continue the program next fall. What a great way to engage in the Jubilee Year! Please RSVP as soon as possible and let me know if you would like me to purchase a workbook for you.




# MISSION STATEMENT

If you cannot join in person, please join them spiritually.





# Blessing of the Home and Household on Epiphany

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung such as "O Come, All Ye Faithful"

**Leader:** The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply, "Amen."

**Leader:** Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace.

Blessed be God forever.

R/. Blessed be God forever.

**Leader:** The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

**Reader:** A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way.> When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham."

**Reader**: "The Gospel of the Lord." R/. "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ."

**Leader:** The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him. **R/.** Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader**: Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, you had no place to lay your head, but in the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray: **R/.** Stay with us, Lord.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer. The leader says the prayer of blessing with hands joined:

Lord God of heaven and earth,

you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them (us) with the light of Christ, that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **R/.** Amen.

Chalk the door, door frame, or plaque with 20+C+M+B+25


The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever.

R/. Amen.

It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song, for example "We Three Kings."






